

A panel will share plans in progress for the Virtual College of Texas that position it to serve in ways not anticipated at its outset.

Created to support statewide, inter-institutional sharing of distance learning courses, VCT has facilitated over 60,000 course enrollments, served more than 40,000 students (semester-to-semester count), and generated approximately \$19.5 million in contact-hour funding.

Concurrent with this effort, VCT has evolved to become something never considered when it was founded: a broad and versatile provider of multiple resources and services based upon principles of collaborating, combining resources, and sharing. These principles contribute to the type of innovative, costeffective higher education that the Texas Legislature,

Governor, and Higher Education Coordinating Board are calling for. Attend this session to get the TACC eLearning Council's latest recommendations on VCT's future and TACC's perspectives. Be prepared to share your own thoughts.

The partners came together with three primary objectives: a) to allow associate degree students to transition into the Bachelor of Science Technology Management program at Texas A&M University, b) to allow Bachelor seeking students to acquire "hands-on" experience, at Blinn College, in a variety of modalities desired by employers and students alike, yet unavailable within their current university program, and c) to encourage dual credit students at A&M Consolidated High School, through the College Station Independent School District, to explore a career path where their credits would be accepted into both an Associate of Applied Science (AAS) and Bachelor of Science (BS) Program.

Branching Out: Building Branch Campuses through College-City Partnerships

In this presentation we will discuss the partnership built between Haltom City leaders and Tarrant County College Northeast Campus to create a branch in a location previously out of reach from the main campus. It is an example of how a city can put to use a previously closed city building. We will share how the branch campus overcame geographical and cultural barriers to higher education and expanded the reach of the college within the Northeast Tarrant County community. Participants will engage in a discussion to identify barriers within their own communities which prevent students from approaching the college.

# **Breakout Session Details continued**

Collaborative Learning Re-Introduced (Austin South)

Presenter: M. Elia Flores, Blinn College

As instructors we have the power to affect the learning process of students in the most positive ways. The literature review reveals that, regardless of the profession or setting, there are similarities in the approach to incorporating collaborative learning into the classroom. Instructors are often not provided proper training or support to help guide them into effective uses and practices for engaging in collaborative learning. The role of the instructors today in the Allied Health field has grown in complexity, often times because of new developments in technology or changes in curriculum requirements you are forced to think outside the box and remove yourself from the traditional podium lecturer. Some allied health collaborative learning activities will be discussed in hopes to promote effectiveness in matching teaching skills to student understanding and experience, providing constructive feedback, effective communication, evaluation fairness, empowerment practices for student learning. Collaborative learning can build confidence, develop nurturing relationships, and therefore, developing a student tool to evaluate the effectiveness of clinical instructors is warranted.

WECM 101 (Ballroom A)

The Workforce Education Course Manual (WECM) Project is an active database of all workforce education courses approved for use by Texas community and technical colleges. The WECM Leadership Committee (WLC) provides three to five course review workshops each year to assure that the end-of-course learning outcomes remain responsive to the needs of industries, employers, and other stakeholders in Texas. This session will present the history, purpose, use, and future of WECM.

Lone Star College System uses data gathered from local industry via Corporate College Partners, Advisory Committees and Focus Groups to lead workforce development initiatives for the college system. Faculty, continuing education SMEs and college leaders work closely with industry to determine real-time workforce and knowledge gaps to update workforce programs and expand current offerings. Qualitative data directly from industry complements quantitative data gathered from local, state and national sources to drive the college response to workforce development needs in Houston.
