Michael Brustein, a national expert on federal CTE legislation, and a longtime friend of TACTE, will conduct the TACTE pre-conference on the new Perkins V law (Public Law 115-224). He will provide a crosswalk between Perkins IV and Perkins V and focus on the key differences. The discussion will include the new accountability requirements, new definitions, and the changes to funding under the Basic Grant and the Rural Reserve. Michael will elaborate on how the new law restricts flexibility on spending at the local level by requiring the colleges to align spending decisions with the gaps identified in the new local needs assessment. Michael will also explain the re-elevation of the focus on special populations. There will be ample time for questions.

As we complete the second year of the initiative, we remain on track to accomplish this goal while our NCLEX pass rates have steadily climbed to over 96%. This presentation will outline our experiences in organizing, planning, and executing a successful growth initiative using a collaborative process designed to increase support from key constituents. We will share the basic structure and monitoring strategies as well as "lessons learned" with a final open discussion with the participants on best practices to manage growth.


9:45 – 10:45 AM Amarillo College President — "Addressing Poverty at Community Colleges"
